

Letter from the Vicar

On the Sunday that our church buildings were able to be used again for public worship, the gospel reading was one of my all-time favourites. At the end of St Matthew's Gospel, chapter 11, Jesus says,

“Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.” (NIV)

I was struck by the three opening words, *‘Come to me...’* What does this incredible invitation from God's own, and only, Son mean for us?

First, Jesus says, *“Come to me”* because of your past. We all have a past – things we're proud of and things we're appalled by. Christ, and Christ alone, is able to make all things new. And here's the wonderful thing – it's never too late to come to him. When he was dying on the cross, Christ spoke to a criminal who was hanged beside him and this is how that exchange – one of the most profound and beautiful exchanges recorded anywhere in the Bible – goes: The criminal asks Jesus, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” And the instant reply from Jesus was this, “Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise.” His forgiveness is just as readily offered today to all who seek it.

Next, Jesus says, *“Come to me”* because you need me in the here and now. Come with your heavy burdens, your weariness. There's no need to pretend. Jesus offers to all who turn to him a different way and, yes, a better way to live. He offers not merely an existence but life – and not just life but life in all its fulness.

And finally, Jesus says, *“Come to me”* because you need me for eternity. “I am the way”, in a world of so many dangerous pathways. “I am the truth”, in a world of so many lies. “I am the life” in a world of so much death and darkness. And, he says, “No one comes to the Father, except through me.”

The truth is that in Jesus Christ, and in him alone, is found our forgiveness and restoration from the past; our surety as we walk through this earthly life; and our hope – hope that lasts not just through this year, this pandemic, not even just through this life – but hope through, and for, all eternity.

Christ's invitation, *“Come to me”*, is made personally to each one of us. How will you respond?

Local dragonflies and damselflies

The Odonata are an order of flying insects that includes the dragonflies and damselflies. The two common groups are easily distinguished:

Dragonflies are usually larger, their eyes touch each other and they rest with their wings up or out, while damselflies are smaller and their eyes are separated. They rest with their wings along their bodies.

All Odonata have aquatic larvae called 'nymphs', and all of them, larvae and adults, are carnivorous. The adults can land, but rarely walk. Their legs are specialised for catching prey. They are almost entirely insectivorous.

County Councillor report by Alastair Adams
August 2020

Dear Resident,

As I write this, news of 14 workers at a food packing plant near Evesham (EVG, Blackminster) have tested positive for Covid-19. Public Health in Worcestershire are working with colleagues in Public Health England and Evesham Vale Growers Limited, to contain this outbreak. The Public Health teams are contact tracing and all staff at the site will be tested for the virus.

It is a reminder to us all that Coronavirus has not gone away and we must continue to wash our hands regularly and socially distance ourselves from others.

Elsewhere in the county Covid-19 cases in hospital and new admissions have slowed significantly. There are five patients with confirmed COVID-19 currently in Worcestershire acute hospitals

From 24 July across the whole country everyone must wear a face covering whilst visiting shops and supermarkets. So please ensure you have a face covering on if you plan to go into either. As you know this will help to stop the spread of Covid-19. Here is the Government advice page on exactly when to wear a face covering.

Environmental Health Officers have worked closely with shops across Worcestershire to ensure they have the necessary safety measures in place to keep customers and staff safe.

The Government announced this week that care homes can now allow visitors where it is assessed to be safe to do so. The latest advice from central government states that ‘visitors should be limited to a single constant visitor, per resident, wherever possible.’ This is to limit the overall number of visitors to the care home and to reduce the risk of infection to residents and staff. This is great news for anyone who has a loved one in a care home as these have been extremely difficult times. Worcestershire County Council has been working with care home managers to develop protocols for safe visiting. With this guidance now in place, social care and public health will review the guidance to support care homes across the county to ensure this can be done safely as Government guidelines are updated. Please check before you visit as each care home may have to adapt to this development.

Up until the end of the school term last week pupil attendance in Worcestershire has been generally higher than the national attendance levels at around 18% of total pupil numbers attending school, following the DfE guidance

Working with partners a ‘Back to School’ programme is underway to plan for the wider reopening of schools in September

The Council’s new business support programme, Here2Help Business is live http://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/info/20807/here2help_business

It is a £3m programme designed to assist local Worcestershire Businesses to recover, adapt, develop and support future resilience as lockdown measures reduce.

During the lockdown period 600 laptops and routers have been delivered to vulnerable children and young people across Worcestershire to support their learning and social support.

The annual Summer Reading Challenge for children aged from 4 to 11 years is taking place this year. Run by the Library Service the event is this year being held online.



1. **Cracks in pavement up Front Street** –It is a major project as a concrete raft is to be installed under the pavement to stop the subsidence. Latest date is estimated for work to start is August 2020.
2. **Road Closure** - C2267 Broad Marston Road from its junction with C2113 Broad Marston Road to Long Marston Road for a distance of 515 metres in a southerly direction. **Overhead works by Openreach - 28th July for 3 days**
3. **High Street Honeybourne** – closed for up to 7 weeks from 2nd August as a new water mains is installed
4. **Speed limit in Ullington** – at the moment the speed limit through Ullington is 60mph, but there is a good argument to reduce this to 40mph. I had a meeting in July with West Mercia Safer Road Partnerships and WCC Highways and they agreed to re-look at the speed limit and will be doing a traffic speed survey in the next few months.



Monthly Parish Council News and Updates August 2020

Parish Council meetings

The next Parish Council meetings are scheduled for **August 3rd** and **September 7th at 7.00pm**

Due to the Covid-19 Virus government lock down regulations preventing any meetings taking place all Parish Council meetings will now be conducted as virtual meetings on the Zoom application over the internet, any members of the public can apply to the Clerk for the link to the join the meeting.

The Annual Parish Meeting is cancelled for this year due the Covid19 regulation.

The Close and Recreation Field

In compliance with Covid-19 Virus regulations all the play equipment on The Close has been put out of use by taping off the equipment and notices placed on the sites informing the public of the closure under the Covid-19 Virus regulation. The MUGA on the recreation field can now be used for tennis only and no other activities are allowed. The Parish Council are well aware of the disappointment the closure has caused to the youngsters of the village and are reviewing the regulations as updates become available. The current regulation requirements are unattainable due to the council resources, but investigations are under consideration to try and resolve the problems of compliance. As soon as the council can comply, and our insurers demands are met the council will open the play area.

The Zip Wire will remain closed as this was reported by RoSPA to be a high risk of failure due to rotted wood requiring replacement. Remedial actions are underway to restore its use as soon as possible.

Cemetery Regulation update

The Council will be reviewing the cemetery regulations and fees along with a proposed new regulation to prohibit any artificial flowers or plastic items being placed in the cemetery. This new prohibition has materialised following the clearance of the eastern boundary when masses of plastic and silk flowers and other plastic items were found on the boundary either dumped there or blown there by the wind. It is an unacceptable high level of plastic pollution in the cemetery therefore control measures are to be considered by the council

Streetlights Update

The continuance of the streetlight upgrade programme has been delayed by the Covid-19 lockdown but is now on track to restart and the next phase

of works will hopefully be completed before the Autumn.

Speeding Traffic

The Parish Council will be considering further options for resolving traffic speeding through Little Meadows as local residents are witnessing a considerable number of violations of the 30pmh speed limit.

An application for a traffic safety audit has been requested from County Highways for the narrow section of Front Street by the Church as the traffic flows have greatly increased in recent times and the section has had several near misses with local traffic


