

Letter from the Vicar

Recently in church we were reflecting on verses from St Mark's Gospel that contain two towering and vital questions – questions that span the breadth of time and that are as relevant today as they were when Christ first asked them. You can read the verses that we were exploring together in chapter 8, verses 27-30. Let me tell you about the two questions, though...

As he walks with the disciples towards the villages of Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asks them, "Who do people say that I am?" It's an innocent enough question. It requires no great thought and certainly no personal commitment. All the disciples have to do is tell Jesus what they've heard *others* say. I suspect the disciples had heard many views expressed about who people thought Jesus was but here's what they were prepared to share with him, "John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets." Note the variety of answers.

In truth, not much has changed. In a survey conducted jointly by the *Church of England, Evangelical Alliance* and the Christian charity, *Hope Together*, adult respondents described Jesus thus:

God in human form – 21%;
A normal human – 17%;
A prophet – 29%;
A fictional or mythical character – 22%;
Don't know – 9%;
Other – 2%;

There is much work for the Church to do, not least of all because Christ's first question, "Who do people say that I am?", was really only a precursor to the real question – the question that Christ asked then and that he still asks today,

"But who do *you* say that I am?"

Suddenly, the question feels far less innocent than the generic, 'Who do *people* say that I am?' This question absolutely does require personal thought or commitment. What is your response to Christ's question, "But who do *you* say that I am?" God in human form? Just another human being? A prophet? A mythical or fictional character? Something else? Or, are you able to reply as St Peter did, "You are the Messiah!"? Your answer, of course, is between you and God. But, if you're not clear about who Christ is in your life, and would like to explore that further, please let me know.

EXCERPTS FROM Minutes of an Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council held

At the Village Hall, Pebworth on Monday 6th September 2021

Present: Councillors: Richard Weller (Chairman), Simon Shiers, Denise Meynell, James Pearson, John Hyde & David Cranage

In attendance: District Councillor Thomas Havemann-Mart, Mrs D Bowles (Clerk)

Also in attendance: 3 members of the public.

Apologies accepted for absence:

Cllr Morrow

Open Forum: The Chairman suspended the formal meeting for the Ward Members and public participation.

a) A streetlight in Friday Street is causing an issue because it is shining brightly into houses – resident has requested either a lower wattage bulb, or for it to go off at 10pm. It was agreed a review of the streetlighting will take place to see which lights are remaining on too long and for Clerk to contact Candela to ensure they all turn off at 11pm.

b) There is an issue with unacceptable behaviour, vandalism and verbal abuse within the village. Clerk to report to Rooftop Housing. Cllr Weller to contact PC Matt Beards. He also reminded residents of the Keep Pebworth Safe WhatsApp group which anyone can request to join.

c) The culverts outside the fire station culverts need attention. Cllr Hyde will investigate.

d) County Councillor Alastair Adams sent his apologies.

Planning Matters:

Description of Proposal: Proposed extension to provide new first floor accommodation. Cllr Weller took no part in the discussion. Following a discussion Members had no comment on this application.

b) 21/1901/HP Location: Thatched End, Broad Marston Rd, Broad Marston, Pebworth, CV37 8XY. Description of Proposal: demolish existing garage and construct new garage and workshop. As this application came in so late it was decided for Members to review this via email and provide their response to the Clerk.

c) 21/01748/HP Location: Chalford House, 1 Mill Field, Pebworth, Stratford Upon Avon, CV37 8UX Description of Proposal: Erection of single and two storey side extension. Following consultation via email Members

had no comment on this application.

Decisions:

- d) 21/00845/FUL Proposed two railway carriage workshops and ancillary building. Location: Sims Metals Uk (South West) Limited, Long Marston, Pebworth, Stratford Upon Avon, CV37 8AQ. Planning Permission Approved.
- e) W/09/01251/PN. (Variation of condition 1 Ref. 18/02512/FUL) Erection of dwellinghouse and associated development. Alternative design approved under planning permission. Location: Land Adjacent Blenheim Farm, Buckle Street, Honeybourne. Planning Permission Approved.
- f) 21/01476/FUL New build dwelling to replace existing barn approved for residential conversion at land adj to Bramble Cottage, Dorsington Rd, Dorsington, Pebworth. Planning Permission Refused.

Enforcement:

- g) Members noted the Clerk has requested an update regarding the proposed enforcement issue at Norton Gardens.
- h) Members noted the report of possible enforcement issues at a site in Long Marston Rd has been investigated with nothing to report.

The Close & Recreation Field

- a) Clerk to obtain quotes for a sign at The Close stating no vehicles on the grass
- b) Members noted the vandalism to the roundabout at The Close.
- c) Members noted S106 monies in the sum of £5,953.30 have been approved by Wychavon District Council for the purchase of wooden trim trail equipment. Clerk has now issued the PO for these works.
- d) Members approved the running of the car boot sale in conjunction with the Pebworth Collective on Sunday 12th September. A risk assessment to be put together; parking, marshalling and rubbish collection is also being arranged.

Cemetery:

- a) Members noted the interment of ashes of Mr M L Foster.
- b) It was resolved for Clerk to order a sign for the gates making it clear that plastic flowers or other artificial items are not allowed to be placed in the burial ground.
- c) It was resolved for the Clerk to carry out a full review of all rules and regulations of the burial ground, following her attendance at a course in July.







County Councillor Report, August 2021

Dear Residents,

I hope you have enjoyed Summer and the new freedoms announced by the government in the last month. After nearly two years of lockdown measures, it at last feels life is starting to get back to normal.

Although most legal restrictions have been lifted, and the majority of the population have been vaccinated, it is still possible to catch and spread COVID-19, even if you

are fully vaccinated, and we are still in the third wave of this pandemic in the UK.

COVID-19 will be a feature of our lives for the foreseeable future, so we need to learn to live with it and manage the risk to ourselves and others.

It is important that we all use personal judgement to manage our own risk. All of us can play our part by exercising common sense and considering the risks. While no situation is risk free, there are actions we can take to protect ourselves and others around us. Following this guidance will help you stay safe and protect others by controlling the spread. Every action to help reduce the spread will reduce any further resurgence of the virus in the coming months.

Most legal restrictions to control COVID-19 have been lifted. This means that:

- You do not need to stay two metres apart from people you do not live with. There are also no limits on the number of people you can meet.
- However, in order to minimise risk at a time of high prevalence, you should limit the close contact you have with those you do not usually live with, and increase close contact gradually. This includes minimising the number, proximity and duration of social contacts.
- You should meet outdoors where possible and let fresh air into homes or other enclosed spaces.
- The Government is no longer instructing people to work from home if they can. However, the Government expects and recommends a gradual return over the summer.
- The requirement to wear face coverings in law has been lifted. However, the Government expects and recommends that people wear



face coverings in crowded areas such as public transport.

- There are no longer limits on the number of people who can attend weddings, civil partnerships, funerals and other life events (including receptions and celebrations). There is no requirement for table service at life events, or restrictions on singing or dancing. You should follow guidance for weddings and funerals to reduce risk and protect yourself and others.
- There are no longer restrictions on group sizes for attending communal worship.

COVID-19 has not gone away, so it's important to remember the actions you can take to keep yourself and others safe. Everybody needs to continue to act carefully and remain cautious.

Update on flooding alleviation/wetlands nature reserve in Broad Marston

Unfortunately, the Environment Agency insisted the Heart of England Forest applied for a permit before the works could begin. But the good news is everyone has helped (Wychavon District Council, Worcestershire County Council, HoEF) to fast track the application and it has been submitted in record time. Hopefully the permit will be quickly issued by the EA, and works can begin in September. The extra good news is a local Broad Marston resident has offered to do the works at cost, and another Broad Marston home owner has offered to pay for the works too. Not only will this scheme hold water back from entering Broad Marston in flood situations, it will also be an all year round wetlands nature reserve with fantastic wild-life and wild flowers. Another fantastic asset for our villages.

NEW Worcestershire Road Gullies Interactive Map

There are over 104,000 road gullies in Worcestershire and keeping them all cleansed and working is a major headache! The council is just trialling a new road gullies map which will be launched to the public by Christmas. Residents will be able to report blocked gullies, see when a gully was last emptied and see if a problem with a gully has been identified and remedy work been programmed. The other good news is with this new mapping system, which will be available on line, the frequency of cleansing certain problematic gullies has been reviewed. For example the gullies under Honeybourne railway bridges on Stratford

Rd will now be emptied every 3 months which hopefully will help reduce the flooding under these bridges.

Afghanistan Resettlement Scheme

There are 2 schemes relating to Afghan resettlement to the UK:

1. The Afghan Relocation and Assistance Policy (ARAP) for Locally Employed Staff (LES) in Afghanistan. This scheme is designed to support those Afghan nationals who have worked with our forces eg interpreters. This scheme was launched in April 2021.
2. The Afghan Citizen Resettlement Scheme (ACRS). This was the scheme that was announced last week and which is designed to welcome 5,000 vulnerable Afghans into the UK in the first year of the scheme and 20,000 over the longer term. Further guidance on this scheme is still awaited.

Locally, the current Afghan resettlement scheme is being co-ordinated by Worcestershire County Council and this will be the same for ACRS. The County Council will work closely with the West Midlands Strategic Migration Partnership who are delivering this programme for the West Midlands on behalf of the Government. The County Council will consider wider support arrangements for Afghan arrivals, co-ordinate financial support from Government and donations from communities. As non-housing stock councils we are working with our housing association partners and private landlords to identify accommodation. Commitment has been sought from both Platform and Rooftop to begin to identify suitable family sized accommodation within our districts that could be appropriate, and both have responded positively to these requests. In addition, we will be working with voluntary groups in due course to help them with their work supporting new arrivals and getting access to funding. Abbey Park Barrier Consultation starts

A consultation was launched on Monday (23 August) asking residents and users of Abbey Park in Pershore for their views on the design of a new barrier to protect the park from illegal encampments. A three-week consultation seeks to confirm whether there is enough public support for the proposal before work is carried out, as it will alter the look and feel of the park. The design uses a mixture of knee height rails and boulders to create a physical barrier around the park, while still allowing easy access for people through entry points. Other options considered included creating bunds, ditches and a full line of boulders to create a barrier around the park. These have been ruled out because it was felt they would not be as effective as other measures and would have a significant impact on the character of the park. It is hoped the barrier will prevent a repeat of recent events, which have seen travellers illegally occupy the land for several days on two separate occasions.

Take part in the consultation. The deadline for responses is 11pm on Sunday, 12 September 2021.

Evesham Levelling Up Fund Application

An application for £9.1m from the Levelling Up Fund for Evesham Town Centre has been submitted for two key projects emerging from the Town Centre Prospectus work. They are Connected Evesham and Evesham Public Hall. The bid will enable growth and enhance Evesham town centre as a place to work, live and play, and improve external perceptions, encouraging additional inward investment. The two projects are designed to be mutually supportive.

John Cooper's Foundation is looking for a Governor to oversee applications from all eligible students



John Cooper's Foundation is a Charity set up in the 17th Century following a bequest from a Mr John Cooper of Long Marston. It was originally set up to educate boys who could not afford private tuition but has evolved over the centuries from being an actual school to giving out small grants to boys and girls who are studying at University for a first degree.

There are ten Governors - two each from the Parishes of Long Marston, Welford. Quinton. Pebworth and Dorsington.

Meetings (in normal times) are held three times a year on Wednesday evenings at 7pm in January, April and October in Long Marston Village Hall and applications are invited from all eligible students and are looked at by all the Governors. Meetings usually last less than half an hour.

Grants are quite small and can range from £25 up to about £80 depending on the number of applicants.

The funds of the Charity are invested with the Charity Commissioners and the money given out is just the interest on this sum.


